## **ED/POAC - COPD Pathway**

For Primary Health Care use



Patient presents to Palmerston North
Emergency Department (ED) with
Shortness of Breath (SOB)

ED clinical team see and treat as per normal procedures

Meets criteria if **ALL** of the following apply:

- ED diagnosis or suspicion of COPD or asthma
- Current smoker/ ex smoker/ long term exposure to second hand smoke
- > 40 years if Maori or Pacifica OR > 50 years if European
- Eligible for funded NZ Healthcare services

Patient identified by ED clinical team as safe for discharge. Patient meets criteria for ED/POAC COPD Pathway and is referred to THINK Hauora

Email referral from ED to

and is alerted to Long Term
Conditions (LTC) facilitator.

Conditions (LTC) facilitator. A copy of fax referral is also sent to LTC facilitator

LTC facilitator makes contact with the CCN - LTC associated with the patient's GP team and provides referral information

Is patient already enrolled with a GP?

LTC facilitator connects patient with an appropriate GP Team

CCN - LTC/GP team undertakes a review (either in person or virtually) within 3-5 days of the patient's ED visit.

At this review the patient will have;

- Respiratory assessment
- Review of meds
- Social supports identified
- COPD Action plan established and entered on Indici/ MedTech patient management system
- Follow up appt booked within 10 14 days

CCN - LTC/GP team undertakes a follow up appt to include;

- Pulmonary rehab
- Smoking history and advice if req.
- Social support follow up
- Medication review (incl Comm Pharmacist if able)
- Discuss options for Flu and Pneumococcal immunisations
- COMPLETE/UPDATE COPD ACTION PLAN and entered on Indici/MedTech patient management system
- If required book in appointment for spirometry testing

Ensure patient is connected with Long Term care for ongoing management.
